AN ACT TO AMEND THE APPROPRIATION ACT, 2011.

ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria—

1. The Appropriation Act, 2011 (in this Act referred to as the “Principal Act”) is amended as set out in this Act.

2. Substitute for the Long Title of the Principal Act, a new Long title—
“A Bill for an Act to authorise the issue from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation the total sum of ₦4,484,736,648,992 (Four Trillion, Four Hundred and Eighty-Four Billion, Seven Hundred and Thirty-Six Million, Six Hundred and Forty-Eight Thousand, Nine Hundred and Ninety-Two Naira) only of which the sum of ₦417,824,288,743 (Four Hundred and Seventeen Billion, Eight Hundred and Twenty-Four Million, Two Hundred and Eighty-Eight Thousand, Seven Hundred and Forty-Three Naira) only is for Statutory Transfers and the sum of ₦495,096,682,115 (Four Hundred and Ninety-Five Billion, Ninety-Six million, Six Hundred and Eighty-Two Thousand, One Hundred and Fifteen Naira) only is for Debt Service, while the sum of ₦2,425,065,124,967 (Two Trillion, Four Hundred and Twenty-Five Billion, Sixty-Five Million, One Hundred and Twenty-Four Thousand, Nine Hundred and Sixty-Seven Naira) only is for Recurrent (Non-Debt) Expenditure and the balance of ₦1,146,750,553,167 (One Trillion, One Hundred and Forty-Six Billion, Seven Hundred and Fifty Million, Five Hundred and Fifty-Three Thousand, One Hundred and Sixty-Seven Naira) only is for contribution to the Development Fund for Capital Expenditure of the Government of the Federation for the Year ending 31st December, 2011.
